## The Last Weekend of In SITE Out: A Teddy Bears Picnic, Arts Market and Garden Writing Workshops

Hundreds of people have been through the Orange Botanic Gardens in the last three weeks to view the art installations and sculptures of In SITE Out.

In SITE Out is a temporary outdoor art event that runs every two years. This year's exhibition attracted artists from across Australia with 30 artworks chosen for display made from everything from metal to ice to icing sugar!

The event wraps up this weekend, **Saturday 17th and Sunday 18th November**, with activities, workshops and an artists market, all part of the Colour City Garden Weekend.

On **Saturday is the Teddy Bears Day Out from 10.30am-12.30pm**. Bring your bear and a picnic lunch for some fun in the gardens. There'll also be **art making activities for kids** with artists Gabriella Hegyes on Saturday and Nyree Reynolds on Sunday.

There'll be lots of local arts and handmade things for sale at the **Artists Market** on Saturday and Sunday. There are still some spots available for artists and crafts people to have a free stall.

On Sunday join landscape architect **Sarah Hoskin at 10am** and garden writer **Fiona Ogilvie at 1pm** for the **Green Words Workshops**. Bookings with Orange City Library on 6393 8132.

Many of the artworks are for sale with some already being snapped up for private gardens of the region. Visitors can also vote in the Orange Regional Arts Foundation **People's Choice Awards** and go in the draw to win \$250.

The Orange Botanic Gardens are in Hill Street Orange. Entry to the gardens is free.
