## Talk2Me

**Regional youth dance project Talk2Me is mid way through creative development of the exciting new full length dance work to be performed in the Central West in May/June.**

Eighteen young dancers from Bathurst, Cowra, Orange, Blayney and Young are working collaboratively with local choreographers Alison Plevey and Larissa Willson exploring ideas and experimenting with movement to express the complex nature of human communication, asking the questions: How do we communicate? and why?

The creative process facilitated by Alison and Larissa enables the young dance enthusiasts the opportunity to create and present their personal experiences of communication, particularly from a regional perspective. It is a hands on experience of creating, collaborating, sharing skills and ideas to bring the work to life.

Choreographer Alison Plevey says that at this half way point "the dancers are working hard to develop their contemporary dance techniques, activating their creative minds and building lasting friendships".

The group will travel to Canberra in the April school holidays to participate in the 'regional youth dance meet' to be hosted by QL2 Centre for Youth Dance. The full work Talk2Me will be performed at BMEC May 27-28 and Cowra Civic Centre June 10. Talk2Me has been supported by The Australia Council for Arts and Local Stages Bathurst in conjunction with Cowra Shire Council, Cowra High School and Arts OutWest.

## From the Executive Officer

**In March I visited Forbes for Brunch of the Bridge.** This was a good example of how the community can be consulted to help create an arts festival. It was also a good chance for me to catch up with the guest speaker at the event, Steve Baldwin, who Arts OutWest has engaged to be one of the mentors on our mentoring program. The morning was highly productive, and a number of conversations that I had have prompted me to make festivals the theme of my ArtSpeak comments this month.

There are many festivals held throughout our region this year, from large events such as Ironfest and the Elvis Festival through to much smaller affairs. Some are strongly arts focused like the Henry Lawson Festival of Arts at Grenfell, but even festivals that do not have arts as their motivation, inevitably feature arts in their programming. So what makes a good festival and why are they important to us? Festivals can be a celebration, an opportunity for a community to share experiences together, a chance to attract people to our regional and rural centres, and a forum to explore and enjoy the things we like or to explore our identity or history. It's difficult to quantify, but we know from studies that festivals can also have economic benefits for the towns and villages that host them. But to do this, it has to be a festival that works. Some of the reasons that have been identified for festivals working is that they must be linked to their communities – come from the grassroots. Events that are imposed on communities rarely have long successful lives. The festivals that are successful have usually started small and built up steadily. They have often gone through difficulties and have had to fight for support, but have had a band of organisers and volunteers that have been prepared to put in the hard work to keep their festival developing. Financial support is often hard to find, and so successful festival organisers have usually shown a combination of disciplined budgeting and organisational skills, resourcefulness and resilience.

Arts OutWest applauds the many people in our communities who work to create the festivals that we enjoy throughout the region. Whether its country music or opera, poetry slams or art shows, the arts is a big component in our festivals and we are happy to support the continuing development of a range of festivals in the Central West.

## ABORIGINAL ARTS

### Art making and business skills for Aboriginal visual artists

**Arts OutWest will hold a series of free visual art workshops especially for Aboriginal artists of the Central West.** The first workshop will be held in Parkes over three days from March 31.

The workshops are open to all Aboriginal visual artists in the region and will be a combination of art making alongside skills for selling your work on the professional market. The sessions are part of the large regional Aboriginal arts program that will culminate in a community gathering, performance and exhibition in Bathurst - **MurraMurra** - in July.

Workshop facilitator Sean Cassidy says the three day visual arts workshops will have an informal feel but address important skills for Aboriginal artists wanting to take their work to the next level:

"Whilst working on art making techniques we'll also look at topics like choosing good materials to work with, how to approach galleries, pricing your work and commissions. I'm also keen to help participants gain confidence in talking about their artwork, bringing the story or

meaning out when explaining it to others," Sean says.

There will also be short a session by Scott Turnbull, Aboriginal Economic Development Officer at the Business Enterprise Centre, on business development for artists.

Artists are asked to bring along their current work and materials. Some materials will also be supplied by Arts Outwest.

"The workshops will run across three days and we hope as many artists as possible from across the region can come along," says Cassidy, "but if people can only make one or two days that will be fine too."

The visual arts workshops will be held in Parkes, Cowra and Dubbo (see panel on the right).

The workshops and regional event have been funded by the NSW Government through Arts NSW. It forms part of Arts OutWest's Aboriginal Arts strategy, a program funded by the federal government through the Office for the Arts'

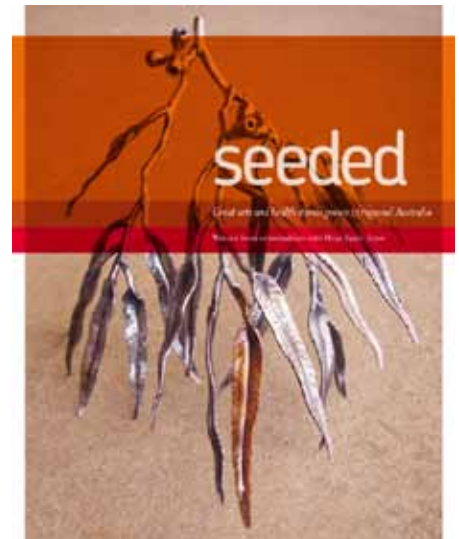
### 'In Sickness and in Health' by Lis Edwards

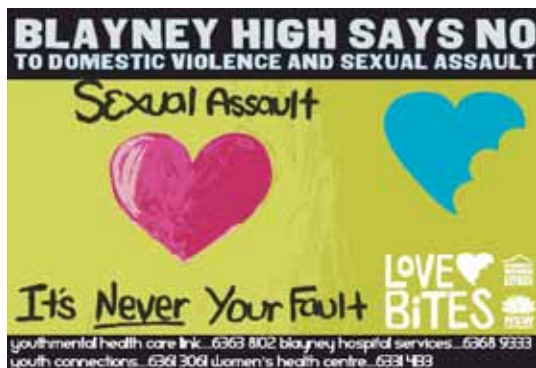
### 'Seeded' now published online

### Love Bites: Art combating domestic violence

**Bathurst Women and Children's Refuge** has been running the Love Bites Program in local high schools, using art skills alongside health messages to say no to domestic violence.

Love Bites is an interactive one day program that works with young people and focuses on young people's relationships. The program consists of workshops on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault and then an art workshop at the end of the day to consolidate the information learnt in the previous sessions. The students get creative with paints, markers, cut outs, graphics design on a graphics tablet, and hip hop workshops to make a song and film clips.

## Oberon Arts Council works complete

**Oberon Arts Council officially opened new public artworks telling Oberon's story from pre-history to the present day in March.**

The collection of works at the Oberon Common include the Diprotodon Youth Mural Mosaic, a Heritage Memory Wall, Family Heritage Pavers and the Terrazzo Tapestries.

The Heritage Memory Walls are the most recent aspect to be completed and tell the story of Oberon from prehistory to now through tiles embossed with significant objects from each era and from different parts of the community. The Come to the Common day included a BBQ picnic lunch, family activities and music from Irish folk group The Mothers of Intention, who also put on a rousing performance on the Saturday night.

These projects have been supported by the Oberon community and have received funding from the Country Arts Support Program (CASP) and the Regional Arts Fund.

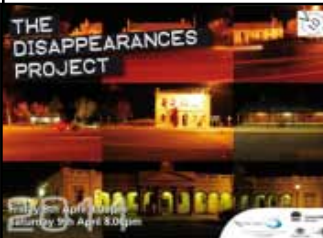
