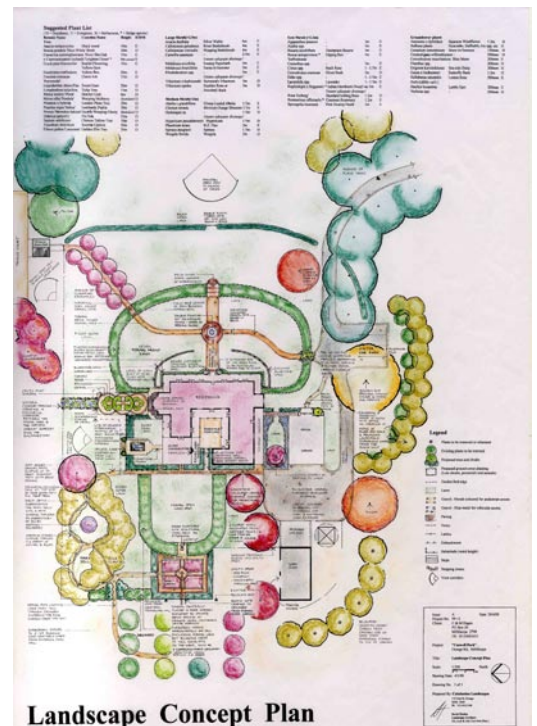
Combining a sense of PLACE and a sense of SELF.

Fiona is an author and a garden writer for The Land newspaper. Her book is titled A Country Garden – creating a garden in rural Australia. It is about her search for the best plants to grow in the Central Tablelands with its dry summers and regular droughts and details about the garden she has been creating since 1988.

Fiona grew up in Britain and after travelling around the world, including long periods in Brussels, Canada and Hong Kong, settled in Australia in 1972. She and husband Bill have made three gardens, the first in Sydney, second at Rockley and the third – the subject of her book - on their farm in the NSW Central Tablelands.

Fiona frequently travels throughout New South Wales to visit gardens and has contributed to a weekly garden column in The Land newspaper since 1995.
